

In the Name of God Amen February the 26th Day in the year of our Lord 1727 I Benjamin Beech of the County of Acornack being very sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory do make and ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form as followeth First I bequeath my soul into the Hands of Almighty God my Maker hoping that through the meritorious Death and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to receive free pardon of all my sins And as for my body to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter nominated.

Hem I give & bequeath to my son Benjamin Beech my Plantation whercon I now live which contains one Hundred & fifty acres of land to it to him & his Heirs lawful begotten of his Body And if he die without such Heirs the same given land to return to my son Thomas Beech & his surviving Heirs for Ever.

Hem I give & bequeath to my three Sons Thomas Beech Luke Beech and Benjamin Beech of them alian.

Hem I give & bequeath all the remainder of my Estate to my loving wife Anna Beech and my will is that she may have the use of my Plantation before given during her widowhood.

I do make, Constitute, & Ordain my Loving Wife sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament revoking all other Wills & Testaments whatsoever as witness my Hand & Seal the Day and year first above written
