I therefore give and bequeath all my personal Estate of what Nature & Condition soever unto my Dear and loving Mother Bridget Custis senr. And do further appoint her my whole sole Executrix of this my last and only Will & Testament. In Witnes whereof I have subscribed my Hand and affixed my Seal this twenty sixth Day of Aprill In the year after Lord one thousand seven hundred & twenty seven
