 J. Charles Bayly without her Consent divided to his son wherefore J. Mary do
 pray that the will may be proved and that her Testament not that it may be
 Entered of Record and as in Duty bound she shall pray

In the Name of God Amen the 27th Day of February 1715
 I Charles Bayly being sick and weak in body but of sound and good memory the
 be to God for J. James do Make this my last will and Testament in manner
 following. That is to say First I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almi-
 God my heavenly Father This I will that to enjoy Eternal Salvation &
 J. Merit of my only Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ, and my body to J. Pa-
 from whence it was taken to be buried at J. discretion of my Executors
 hereafter named.

I give and bequeath unto my son John Bayly my half part of 8 or
 Diamond. I likewise give unto my said son my set of Surveying Instrum-
 and all my Books of J. Law and Geometry all my wearing Apparel one Pair of
 gold buttons and my Silver Sheet Buckles. I likewise give unto my son John Bayly
 my new Perforator

I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Bayly all that tract of
 land that J. Honourable Charles Scarborough Esq^r bought of Justice on by
 containing nine hundred fifty nine acres and a half situate lying on Pung-
 atigue Creek and generally known by J. Name of year neck to him & the
 heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever and for want of such issue
 I give it before mentioned land unto my two Daughters Elizabeth &
 Edith Bayly and J. heirs of their body lawfully begotten for ever but
 if either of my said Daughters dye with out issue I give her part
 unto my son John Bayly and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten
 for ever my will is that J. division of J. fore said land between my
 two Daughters begin at J. Center or middle of J. now Neck fence as
 running North to Pungatigue Creek And from J. Bounds into J. woods to be
 extended to J. head of J. land from J. first Bounder I likewise give unto my
 son Charles Bayly a Pair of Gold Buttons.

My will is that my half part of J. Court house land containing two
 hundred twenty five acres be sold by either of my trustees hereafter named
 and the value thereof to be Employed wholly in J. Education and Mainte-
 nance of my Children when my wife shall see fit.

I give unto my loving wife Mary Bayly A New Side Saddle and farnish
 which Saddle came in from England altho fifteen hundred pounds of
 tobacco to buy her a Riding horse and all my ready money I give unto my
 wife I likewise give unto my fore J. wife J. use of all my Estate undi-
 of be it of what Nature and Kind soever during her widow hood but if
 she should happen to marry my will is that all my Estate last men-
 tioned be divided into three Equal Parts and my wife to have one Part
 her first Choice and J. other two parts Remaining to be Equally divided
 between my son Charles, Elizabeth and Edith Bayly But if either of
 my J. Children happen to dye before there Capable of Receiving J.
 same I give these parts to my wife and Children to be Equally divided
 My will and Desire is that all my Estate be Inventoried within some
 convenient time By my worthy friends Capt John Bradhurst Mr. Richard
 Kibon Mr. Arthur Uphar and Mr John Parnall or any two of them
 whom I appoint Trustees of this my last will and Testament I do
 by these Presents Make and Ordain my Aforesaid wife Mary Bayly
