mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for it do make and ordain this my last will and Testam
in manner following first I give and bequeath my soule unto the hands of God who gave it Trusting tha
through the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ I shall have eternall Salvation and for
such worldly goods as the goodness of God hath bestowed on me I dispose in manner following —
Item I give and bequeath to my Brother George Parker all my Cattle Item I give and bequeath
unto my brother Charles Parker my negro man named London also all the rest of my Estate
in what kind soever it be Lastly I do make constitute and appoint my brother Henry
Parker Executor of this my Last will and Testament ~~Revoking all and discharging~~
all former wills and Testaments by me ever before made In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my Seal this fiftten day of February One Thousand seven Hundred and
Twenty Seven. Signed Sealed published pronounced and declared by the above Testator Henry
Parker as aforesaid as his last will and Testament in the presence of:

Low Condition but of very good sound & perfect memory do recommend my soule & Body unto almighty
God hoping at the last day to Inherit the Kingdom of Heaven Amen And this the Contents are
followeth And I do make this my last will and Testament &c Item I give will and bequeath
unto my son Danall Steward all my land to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body
and if he should die without heirs lawfully begotten of his Body Then one hundred and Twenty five
Acres and plantation to fall to my Youngest daughter Martha Steward: and the tother hundred
and Twenty five Acres to my daughter Sabitha Steward to her and her heirs for ever And the
bounder shall be a White Oak Standing upon a Elmsh marked with three notches one both

Sides and they shall not sell to no body before they come to Thirty years of age in case they sell to one another I tern I give unto my son two Iron Hinges and Iron plow and all the Iron work besides the pots I give to my son Daniell Steward the first two Colts that my mare brings and if Joseph Stockly cant maintain them he shall sell them for what he thinks fit for him I give to my son Daniel Steward my Gun I give to my daughter Elizabeth Steward one feather bed her choice and large Iron pot and Iron Putter Dish and fore putter plates and double spinning wheel and Cox Iron and Black Gourd and petticoat this Country make and Stuffed Gourd and petticoat and Serge mantle and three year old heifer and one ew and Weaker and to have as much meatt and Corn as will last her this year forring and if she should die without heir that my son Daniell Steward should have the ^{the son of Jos. Stockly} Bed and goats I give to my Godson John Boone my old Cow and yearling I give to Joseph Stockly my mare yearling I tern I give will and bequeath unto my daughter Tabitha Steward and Martha Steward all the remaining part of my Estate visable and invisable to be equally divided as my daughters comes to the age of Eighteen but not to sell till they come to the age Twenty unless their Ex.^{rs} is willing. I sett my daughter Tabitha Steward and Martha Steward at age sixteen I sett my son Daniell Steward at age at Eighteen I have my two daughters Tabitha Steward and Martha Steward to Alexander Daniell if he wont take them I leave them to John Boone and if never a one of them will take them ^{then} Joseph Stockly doe what he will with them I will and bequeath that my brother in Law Joseph Stockly do make him my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 4th day of January anno domi 1727

Daniell Morrow three pecks of wheat owes to me. William Johnson Dr to three pecks of Corn and a pair of Shoes making Robert Barsten Dr to three pecks of Corn. Forshaw Brien Dr to two pound and a half of Torve Thread John Robinson one pair of Shilders two flays one hackle one old weavers come to me that John Boone or Samuell Owen may have the said John Robson till he comes to the age of one and Twenty.
