 Hugh Roberts and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body the house and
 plantation upon which I live, for ever, as also one negro girl named Bazar
 after the decease of his mother, & in case of Negro girl lives & have children
 I leave to my daughter Elizabeth her first child. it lives till it is eighteen
 months old and likewise to my daughter Ketharine if next that lives to
 w: fore age. I give to my wife what money is in my house and also
 all my Cattell & other stock out doors I leave also four thousand foot of
 pland one half of it to my son, & the other halfe to be divided between
 my two daughters, as also I give to my son Rip Joyner's Chairs & a table
 off of same wood with it. Chairs, as also my own little Chirk, as also a

 attains to q: age of fifteen. I leave all of Rest of my household furniture
