in the Colony of Virginia widow being in healthful & weak condition yet of sound
mind & memory thanks be given to almighty God therefore To make & ordain this
my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following First & principally I
Bequeath my Soul into the hands of God who gave it Hoping by the merits
of Jesus Christ my Saviour I shall obtain Eternal Salvation And as for such
worldly Goods as the Goodness of God hath bestowed upon me I dispose thereof in
manner following VIZ

(besides what I have already given to him) one Large flowered silver Cup with
two handles one Large silver salt cellar & a Chest also an Equal part of all
my store Goods & money with the Rest of his Brothers & Sisters also one
Volume of the Rev. Mr. Stephen Charnock's Works and a share of my other
Books with the rest of his Brethren & Sisters

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Charles Scarborough & to the heirs of his body (besides
what I have already given to him) one silver Tankard one Chest one small
braff Kettle also an Equal part of all my store Goods & money with the rest
of his Brothers & Sisters with a share of all my books Mr. Charnock's two volumes
excepted

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my son Henry Scarborough One Negro man named
Samplon one negro woman named Nella with their Increase also one Great
silver punch bowl one Great looking Glass a Russia leather Couch a Great Cup-
board a little Chest of drawers one Sogiron one hand mill the Horse mill Stones
Soder millstones the millstones which lie in the Creek one Volume of the Rev.
Mr. Stephen Charnock's Works also one Equal part of all my store Goods & money
with the rest of his Brothers & Sisters and a share of my other Books
Equally with the rest of his Brothers & Sisters Mr. Charnock's two volumes being
to disposed of as herein is bequeathed (like wise) a fourth part of all my pewter
& household Linen also my Great Copper provided my said son Henry in Con-
sideration of said Copper do & shall allow & pay unto each of his three Sisters
Mary Leatherbury Sarah Black & Tabitha Bagwell a Copper Kettle of two pounds
sterling price in such reasonable time as he can conveniently perform of same

what I have already given to her and now in her possession) one Negro
woman named Swett & one Negro girl named Nanney with her Increase to be
by her disposed of as the may please among her Children also one silver Tankard
one large silver porringer three silver spoons one feather bed and bolster &
two pillows one Rugg & one pair of Blankets one Seal skin Trunk two Russia leather
Chairs four cane chairs one large braff Kettle one pair of braff andirons
one iron pot one Sogiron & one iron Chaffing Dish also an Equal part of
all my store Goods & money & Books as aforesaid with the rest of her Brothers & Sisters
likewise a fourth part of all my pewter & household Linen

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Black & to the heirs of her body (besides
what I have already given to her & now in her possession) a negro man named Abo
& a negro woman named Bess already in her possession also a negro woman named
Mary or small with her small child named Daniel & all her future Increase
But if in case my said Daughter should have no issue of her body then I Give
& Bequeath the aforesaid Negroes with their Increase unto my said Daughter
Sarah so as to be by her disposed of as the may please also my largest
silver Tankard one silver porringer three silver spoons one feather bed & bolster
two pillows one Rugg & one pair of Blankets two Russia leather Chairs four cane
Chairs one Chest of Drawers one Seal skin Trunk one braff Kettle one pair
of braff andirons one Sogiron & one iron pot also an Equal part of all my store
Goods & money & Books as aforesaid with the rest of her Brothers & Sisters likewise a fourth
part of all my pewter & household Linen & also one small braff Kettle

Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Tabitha Bagwell (besides what I have already
given to her & now in her possession) one Negro woman named Jenny & one Negro Woman
named Sarah now in her possession with all their Increase also one Negro Man named
Bristol during the natural life of my said Daughter Tabitha and after her Decease then
I will bequeath the said Negroes with their future Increase to be Equally divided
among the Children of my said Daughter Tabitha also I Give & Bequeath unto my
said Daughter Tabitha one silver Tankard one large silver porringer three silver
spoons one feather bed & bolster two pillows one Rugg & one pair of Blankets also
one suit of Chinese curtains & Vallance with Counterpane Chairs & the other appur-
tenances belonging thereto also one dutch Cupboard one great Chest one Table two
cane Chairs also one brandy Still one pewter Still a middle sized braff Kettle
a braff Chaffing Dish one bell metal Skillet one smothering iron one iron dripping
pan one iron pot with pothooks one pair of andirons & one Sogiron also an Equal
part of all my store goods & money & books as aforesaid with the rest of her Brothers &
Sisters like with a fourth part of all my pewter & household Linen I also give
