teen hundred and Twenty eight in the first Year of the reign of our Sovereign
Lord King George the second of Great Brittain France & Ireland King of
England George well of the aforesaid County being Sick & weak in body but of sound & perfect
memory blessed be god & knowing the uncertainty of this life on earth & being desirous
to settle things on earth in order to my dissolution do make this my last will &
Testament in manner & form following. Inprimis I bequeath my soul into the
hands of Almighty God & my body to the Earth thereon to be decently interred to
the discretion of my &c. hereafter mentioned. I give my Sister Anne Glading
the use of one half my plantation lying on Hunting Creek which I now live on
with the use of half the Houses Orchard & Marshes during her Natural
life, and the use of the other half of the said plantation houses orchards & Marshes
to my Cozen Tabitha Gray during her Natural life & after their decease I give
& bequeath to Thomas Tatham who now keep at School to William Willson
the said plantation with all appurtenances thereunto belonging to him & his heirs
3^d And my will & desire is that my Negroe man Tom Bell shall remain with my
Sister Anne Glading & my Cozen Tabitha Gray during their Natural lives & my
intent and meaning is that my said Sister shall have the said Negroe the full term
of one Year at a time and my said Cozⁿ the full term of another Year at a time
& so to return to one from the other as long as they both shall live but my will
& desire is that my Negroe Tom Bell shall have every Saturday to himself
& for his own use during his life & that my said Sister Anne Glading & my Cozⁿ
Tabitha Gray nor any one that shall possess him after their decease shall
debar nor confine him from the liberty which I have given him And after
my said Sister & Cozen Decease I give & bequeath the said Negroe Tom Bell
to Thomas Tatham to him & his heirs forever 4th I give the use & service
of my Negroe boy Will to my Sister Comfort Tatham during her Natural
life and after her decease I give & bequeath y^e said Negroe boy to my Cozen
Comfort Young upon the provizer she pay to my Cozⁿ Sarah Tatham the sum
of Ten pounds Current money of Virginia 5th I give & bequeath to my Sister
Comfort Tatham my Cart mare 6th I give & bequeath to my Sister in law
Comfort well my black mare meaning the Widow well 7th I give & bequeath
to my Brother Solomon well my Chest Drawers 8th I give & bequeath to my
Cozen Jane Parincastle two thousand pounds of Tobacco to be paid at five
hundred year 9th I give & bequeath to my kinsman Thomas O'New my still and my
great iron pot 10th I give & bequeath to Matilda Lewis one bed & furniture common

calling hers. 11. I give & bequeath to Anne Lewis the first Born of Matilda Lewis one Penny
 12. I give & bequeath to Anne Tatham one Thousand pounds of Tobacco 13. I give & bequeath
 to my Sister in Law the wife of my Brother Solomon Ewell Thirty Shillings Currency to
 her a Gold Ring. 14. I give & bequeath to my Cousin Naomi Ewell Twenty Shillings to
 buy her a ring 15. I give & bequeath to Margaret Deal one bed & furniture which I own
 mostly by one & one new rug 16. I give & bequeath to my Cousin George Glading my
 best bed & furniture which I own & my Silk Rug. Lastly I do give full power to my
 & hereafter Mentioned to sell make Sail or dispose of all the rest of my Estate
 not already given both real & personal for the paying & satisfying my Debts &
 the overplus for the maintaining Thomas Tatham & Anne Glading Children and for
 ordain I constitute & appoint my Brother Solomon Ewell & my Sister Anne Glading
 & my Cousin Sabitha Gray Executor & Executrices of this my last will & Testament
 revoking all other wills heretofore by me made In Witness whereof I have Signed & Sealed
 these presents this 24th day of April Anno. 1728 (the words are interlined between 7 & 800
