I give and bequeath unto my Sister floriana a feather Bed and the furniture thereto belonging and a Chest and one box & three puter plates

I give and bequeath unto my brother Cornelius four year of Kersey and the Chest he made for me and Iron Spitt & one saw

I give and bequeath unto my Sister Elisabeth Twisford one Cow and one Cow to her son William Twisford
