

In the name of God Amen I Will Drummond of Accomack County in Virginia being in
and weak of Body but of sound and perfect mind and knowing the certainty of death and that
all flesh must yield therunto when it shall please God to call do hereby make this my
Last Will and Testament as followeth First I give my soul to God my Creator hoping
through the merits of my only Saviour Jesus Christ to obtain full pardon & Remission
all my sins my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of those that shall
appoint to be my Executors as for my worldly Goods & Estate that it hath pleased God to
bestow on me I give & bequeath as followeth First I will that all my just & honest
Debts be fully paid unto all men out of my Estate Item I give and bequeath the plantation
where that I live on being three hundred acres & the appurtenances therunto belong-
ing unto my loving wife Sabra Drummond during her Natural life at her decease
then I will and give the said land & plantation unto my Youngest daughter Sabra
& her heirs forever & in case my said daughter should dye without Lawfull Heirs of her
Body then I give the above said land and plantation unto my daughter Tabitha Drummond
to her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath my water mill and all the appurtenances
therunto belonging unto my loving wife Sabra during her natural life and at her
decease I give the said Mill to my daughter Sabra and her heirs forever and in case
my daughter Sabra should dye without Lawfull heirs of her Body then I give the
said Mill & appurtenances therunto belonging unto my daughter Tabitha & her heirs
forever Item I give and bequeath Two hundred Acres of Land that I bought of
John Senfer of Barre lying on the above said Mill Branches unto my daughter Patience
Drummond and her heirs forever and in case my daughter Patience should dye with-
out Lawfull Issue then I will and give the said Two hundred Acres of Land unto
my daughter Elizabeth & her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath all my other
Lands wheresoever both in Virginia and Maryland unto my three daughters Elizabeth
Elizabeth & Tabitha to be equally divided between them and there severall heirs forever
and if either my three daughter should dye without Lawfull Issue then my will is that
the surviving sisters enjoy & possess her or her proportion part of my said lands for-
ever to them & their heirs Item I give & bequeath & will unto my five daughters as my
Negro slaves the youngest of my five daughters to have the first choice and the
the choice to continue to the Next Item my will is that my loving wife Sabra
make the choice of Negroes for my two Youngest daughters Sabra and Patience and that
the said Negroes when there to be with my loving wife Sabra for her use & benefit dur-
ing her life and at her death to be then my said daughters and if the said Negroes should
increase before my Youngest daughters doth receive them then my will is that the in-
crease be equally divided between my daughter Sabra & Patience Item I give and be-
queath to my five daughters to each of them a good feather bed & bolster a rug a blan-
ket a pair of Sheets Item I give and bequeath all the rest of my feather Beds or cov-
ers unto my loving wife Sabra Item my will and desire is that my Molata woman
Elizabeth & her son surry be my wives what time they are to serve for her use and
be ought to be at her disposal to any of my Children when she shall think fit & to whom
Item I give and bequeath all my Stock of hogs unto my Lov. wife Sabra also my
Cart wheels plow axes and hoes Harrow and the work oxen & my black Mare Item
my will is that if either of my Youngest daughter Sabra or Patience should dye or both
without Lawfull Issue & by that means my two daughters Elizabeth & Tabitha be
heirs to the Land that I have given to Sabra and Patience in or for part of my
will then my will is that Elizabeth or Tabitha be cut off from enjoying any of
my Land to them already given in this Will Item my Will is that such

never of my daughters should enjoy & possess the plantation that I have on the top land
 Acres of land that I bought of John Snijder & Cuthbert. I do give them liberty to get timber
 out of my Swamp that I bought of Thomas Preson for their plantations use, but not
 Liberty to sell or give. Item my will is that all my personal Estate both within doors
 and without & whatsoever & wheresoever be Invenories & appraised & then to be equally
 divided between my loving wife & five daughters. Item my will is & desire is that
 Thomas Preson, Heirs make over & give of the land according to Bond unto those that
 I have given it to in this my last will and Testament. Lastly I constitute and ap-
 point & ordain my loving wife Anne, executrix & Daniel Welbourne, one
 of this my last will and Testament in confirmation that this is my last will
 & Testament I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of March 1724

 to be his last will & Testament before us
