my son Solomon Bird shall have privilege to get Timber on any part of my Land for his
plantations use and that my afore. sons shall not sell nor dispose of any Timber of their

that is in my house and Sixty yards of Crown Linen and a peice of Irish Linen containing
Twenty three yards Item I give unto my son Nathaniel Bird one Iron pot which he now
has and two Cows and Calves Item All the Rest of my Estate of what kind so ever I give to
my four sons Namely Born Daniell Major and Solomon Bird to be equally divided
