now calling to mind the brevity of this life. And the certainty of approaching death
And that all flesh must yield when it shall please God to call. and being willing
to settle things before death do make this my last will and Testament in manner &
form following. And first chiefly and principally I commit my soul to Almighty
God my Creator hoping to receive full pardon and remissions of all my sins &
be saved by the precious death & merits of my blessed saviour & redeemer Jesus
Christ and my body I commit to the dust from whence it was taken to be
by my wife in such decent manner as shall be thought fitt by my Executor
And for such Temporal Estate as it hath pleased God to lend me my will &
desire is, that the same may be employed and bestowed as by this my last will
is expressed. And by which I give and bequeath unto Jephtha Samons Alias
Perry my adopted son & him whom I have adopted I give all my personall
Estate visible and invisible, except my carer which I give unto Samuell Jester the
father in law of my adopted son Jephtha Perry I also ordain constitute and
appoint the said Jephtha sole Executor of this my last will & Testament as
Witness my hand & seal this 26th of January 1725/6

In the Names of God Amen the 23rd Day of January 1728 I John
Chandler of Accomack County in Virginia being very ancient but imperfect
Health and sound of memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and Test-
ament in manner and form following (Viz. ⁺) I promise first I recommend my soul
into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to the earth from whence
it came to be buried up as Christians like manner at the discretion of my lat^h here-
after

mentioned and as touching what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me I dispose of as followeth First I give and bequeath to my son Hather jett place Chandler my weaving Loom with all the Harnes belonging to it Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Solomon Chandler one hand saw one drawing Knife one Cyprus Chest one pair Gloves which is att William Phillips Thirdly I give & bequeath to my daughter Bridgett Powell two pewter plates two earthen Dishes one pewter porringer which is at William Phillips Fourthly I give to my daughter Abigail Phillips one Shilling no Sterling money Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Charity Arlinton all the remaining part of my Estate be it in what nature or kind or quality soever to her and her heirs (only nine head of Cattle and eighteen heads of Sheep and Twenty five hogs which I delivered to my son in Law William Phillips in consideration of mine and my wifes Troubles while we lived with him accepted Sixthly I nominate and appoint my son in Law John Arlinton my whole and sole executor of this my Last will and Testament revoking and disannulling all other wills and bequests by me before made in confirmation that this is my Last will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this day & year above Written.

This Indenture made this Thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord one
Thousand seven hundred Twenty and Nine and in the Third year of the Reign of our
Sovereign Lords King George the Second King of England Scotland France and
Ireland Defender of the Faith &c. Between Nottingham Abdell of Northampton
County in the Colony of Virginia Planter of the one part and David James of Accomack
County in the Colony above said Planter of the other part. Witnesseth that the
said Nottingham Abdell for and in consideration of a certain Plantation containing
one Hundred acres of Land lying and being in Northampton aforesaid on the head
of Muswader with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging Received of the said
David James the Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have sold Granted assigned
Infeoffed and Delivered and doe by these presents Sell Grant assign Infeoff
and deliver unto the said David James his heirs and assigns forever a certain piece
all of Land containing Two hundred acres more or less Situate lying and being in
Accomack County aforesaid Bounded on the one side by the Branch from the Bridge
