God my Creator hoping to receive full pardon and remission of all my sins &  
beware by the precious death & merits of my blessed Saviour & redeemer Jesus  
Christ and my body I committ to the dust from whence it was taken to be  
by my wife in such decent manner as shall be thought fit by my Executor  
And for such Temporal estate as it hath pleased God to lend me my will &  
desire is that the same may be employed and bestowed as by this my last will  
is expressed. And by which I give and bequeath unto Jephtha Samon alias  
Perry my adopted son & him whom I have adopted I give all my personal  
Estate Visible and invisible except my cane which I give unto Samuel Fester the  
father in law of my adopted son Jephtha Perry. Also ordain constitute and  
appoint the said Jephtha Fester Executor of this my last will & Testament as

ament in manner and form following (Viz t) I promise first I recommend my soul  
into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to this Earth from whence  
it came to be buried me as Christian like manner at the discretion of my law here

mentioned and as touching what worldly Estate it bath pleased God to bestow on me  
I dispose of as followeth first I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel my  
place Chandler my weareing Clothe with all the Harness belonging to it Secondly I give  
and bequeath to my son Solomon Chandler one hand saw & one drawing knife  
one Cypris Chest one pair Gloves which is at William Phillips Thirdly I give &  
bequeath to my daughter Bridgett Powell Two Pewter Pottles two Earthen D<sup>r</sup> one  
Pewter porringer which is at William Phillips Fourthly I give to my daug-  
hter Abigail Phillips one Shilling in Sterling money Fifthly I give and be-  
queath to my daughter Charity Arlington all the remaining part of my Estate  
be it in what nature & Kind or quality soever to her and her heirs (only nine  
head of Cattle and eighteen head of Sheep and Twenty five hogs which I delivered  
to my son in Law William Phillips in consideration of mine and my wifes Troubles  
while we lived with him accepted Sixthly I nominate and appoint my son in Law  
John Arlington my whole and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament  
revoking and disannulling all other wills and bequests by me before made in confirmation  
that this is my last will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this  
day & year above written.
