 don for all my sins & a place among y^e Elect in endless happiness & for w^h last
 worldly Estate I Lord in mercy has bestowed on me I doe order & bequeath in
 manner following I give & bequeath to my son William Littleton my Planta
 tion I now live on w^h all of my land & plantation hereunto belonging being by Option
 two hundred acres of land to him & his heirs for ever I Give & bequeath to my
 daughter Tabitha wards one good feather bed with Pillow two new Blankets
 & a Quilt & a large Iron Pot of a bout nine Gallons & in Case my d^e Daughter
 Tabitha shall fail of coming or binding for 2 above I Legasys three years
 then I Give & bequeath w^h aforesaid bed Pillow Blankets Quilt & pot to my
 son Thomas Littleton to him & his heirs for ever I Give & bequeath
 to my son John Littleton one Cow & calf to him & his heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath to my daughter Comfort Cowson one Cow & calf to her & her
 heirs for ever Also I Give to my daughter Comfort two Dues to her & her heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath to my daughter Ann Mary Littleton six hundred pounds
 of Tobacco & two Dues to her & her heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath to my son Charles Littleton my horse smother to him & his
 heirs for ever I Give & bequeath all y^e Rest of my Estate to my four sons Charles
 mark Edmund & Thomas Littleton to be Equally divided amongst them to y^e
 & their heirs for ever I doe also Give my son Thomas two years tith
 -ing my son William to pay for y^e same I doe also Give to my four
 sons Charles mark Edmund & Thomas five hundred pounds of Tobacco to pay
 of them to be paid by my son William as they shall come to y^e age of
 Eighteen years old

I doe order & appoint my son William Littleton to be whole & sole
 Executor & to see this my last will & Testament fully & performed in all
 points according to y^e true intent & meaning thereof all which I doe
 confirm with my hand & Seal this 15th day of September 1718
