 Earth & of all flesh must submit to death when it pleases God to
 therefore desirous to settle things in order & to dispose of my
 estate I have pleased God far beyond my desires to bestow upon me
 ordain & appoint this my last will & testament to
 & to my son as follows I am prime & bequeath my soul in
 of Almighty God who gave it to my body to be with him
 come to receive such death & Christian burial as by my
 named shall be thought most meet & fitting; In kind & I

 tion I now live on with all J. appurtenances thereunto belonging being by Option a
 two hundred acres of Land to him & his heirs for ever I Give & bequeath to my
 daughter Tabitha wards one good feather bed with Pillow two new Blankets
 & a Quilt & a large Iron Pot of a bout nine Gallons & in Case my D. Daughter
 Tabitha shall fail of coming or binding for 3 above I Lego for three years
 then I Give & bequeath to my son Thomas Littleton one Cow & calf to him & his heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath to my daughter Comfort Cowson one Cow & calf to her & her
 heirs for ever also I Give to my daughter Comfort two Doves to her & her heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath to my daughter Ann Mary Littleton six hundred pounds
 of Tobacco & two Doves to her & her heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath to my son Charles Littleton my horse smother to him & his
 heirs for ever I Give & bequeath all J. Rest of my Estate to my four sons Charles
 mark Edmund & Thomas Littleton to be Equally divided amongst them to J.
 & their heirs for ever I doe also Give my son Thomas two years time
 doing my son William to pay for J. same I doe also Give to my four
 sons Charles mark Edmund & Thomas five hundred pounds of Tobacco to pay
 of them to be paid by my son William as they shall come to J. age of
 eighteen years old
