last Will & Testament in manner following. First I give & bequeath my Soul into
the Hands of Almighty God who gave it, Trusting that in and by the Merits of my
blessed Saviour Jesus Christ I shall have eternal salvation, And for such worldly
Goods as the goodness of God hath bestowed on me I doe dispose of in Manner follow-
ing I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth now Wife of Stephen Horsey of
Somerset County in Maryland all that part of my Estate already given & deliv-
er'd, and to the Heirs of her Body for ever. Also a young Mare now running on
my Island on the Sea Side.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Reavell a young Mare & a Horse, also
her choice of a Bed & furniture & suitable also her equal fourth part of all unmade
Linnen and new pewter and her equal fourth part of all my Table Linnen & Sheets
Also I give to my said Daughter Ann a Negroe Girl called Nan and a Negroe Boy
called Isaac to her and to the Heirs of her Body lawfully begotten, but if my said
Daughter Ann dies without such Heirs then I give the said two young Negroes
Nan and Isaac to my two Daughters Rachell and Sarah Reavell and to their Heirs
also I give my said Daughter a Double Loone & four pistoles of Gold, also a
silver quart Tankard marked on the fore part with the Letters I R and her
equal fourth part of all my silver Spoones, also an Iron pott of four Gallons
A pott Hooks and a good frying pan, also I give to my said Daughter Ten
head of Cattle & ten Sheeps Liberty to keep the same on my Island during
her continuing unmarried, I also give to my said Daughter an Elm Chest

Item. I give to my Daughter Rachell now Wife of Abell Upshur Gent: her second choice
of a Bed & furniture suitable, also her equal fourth part of all my unmade
Linnen and new pewter and of my Table Linnen & Sheets. I also give to my said
Daughter Rachell a Negroe Boy called Daniel & a Negroe Girl called Sarah to
her & the Heirs of her Body for ever. Also I give to my said Daughter Rachell
a silver quart Tankard marked with the Letters I R and her equal fourth part
of all my silver Spoones & a Double Loone of Gold also an Iron pott of four
Gallons & a good frying pan, also I give her ten head of Cattle & ten
also an Elm Chest

Item. I give to my Daughter Sarah Reavell her third choice of a Bed & furniture
suitable, also her equal fourth part of all my unmade Linnen and pewter &
her equal fourth part of all my Table Linnen and Sheets, Also I give to my said
Daughter Sarah a young Negroe Hatch called Hannah and a Negroe Boy called
George to her and to the Heirs of her Body lawfully begotten, and for want of such
Heirs then to the next Heirs of me the Testator for ever. I also give to my said
Daughter a silver quart Tankard not be me already given and her equal
fourth part of all my silver Spoones also an Iron pott of four Gallons
A pott Hooks & a good frying pan, also I give to my said Daughter ten head of
Cattle & ten Sheeps Liberty for the same to be and remaine on my Island
during her continuing unmarried, also I give my said Daughter one Double Loone
of Gold also a silver Basin & two old silver Spoones broken also an Elm Chest

Item. I give to my Granddaughter Sarah Reavell a Double Loone & a small Gold ring
also I give to my Granddaughter Rachell a Double Loone

Item. I give to my Son Edward Reavell all the remaining part of my Estate
be me already given both real & personal both in Virginia & elsewhere
to him & his Heirs for ever.

Lastly I doe hereby Nominate constitute and Appoint my Son
Edward

I live to her and her Heirs after her Mothers Decease, And in case my Daughter
Mary Linney die without Heir then to return to my Daughter John Fogg &
her Heirs

m. I give unto my Daughter Mary Linney one Feather Bed with Hands and
Cover with lock and Key, one pot, one spinning wheel one young Mare
and one Dipping spinn.

m. I give & bequeath unto John Tempelton all my wearing Cloaths

m. I give & bequeath to my Loving Wife all the residue of my personal
Estate which I ordaine my Loving Wife whole and sole Executors & Ex^{ts} of it
this my last Will & Testament, Whereunto I set my Hand and Seal
