In the Name of God Amen I owing Minion of the County aforesaid being very sick of body but of perfect memory thanks be to God doe make this my Last will & Testament in manner and form as follows first of all I do leave my soul to God that gave it and to Christ my Redemer in whose worth I trust to find Redemption & secondly I commit my body to the Earth to be decently buried at w<sup>t</sup> discretion of my Executors.

Firstly I do give one mare and mare colt to Run her and her increase alway between my loving wife Margaret Minion and Rowland Hodger which said mare is to be taken of the Island where they now are at this present fall by the Dr. Rowland Hodger far ther the aforesaid Hodger is charged to sell them away of their increase yielding to the aforesaid Margaret half of the pay or profit.

Secondly I do give and bequeath to my Godson Joshua Lacy one two year old heifer her and her increase w<sup>t</sup> his life is to be moved of the Island where they now are

Thirdly I do give & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Sarah Hodger two after the one to be delivered forth with which is a red three year old heifer at the next Spring and the other to be his year old and to be grazed at her Grand Mother's

descretion.

Fourthly I do leave my d<sup>r</sup> Loving Daughter Ann but twelve pence to keep her in

any other part of my State what so ever

Lastly I do give and bequeath all singular of my Goods and Chattels that it has been keept God to grow on me as horses and Cattell and Sheep and hogs and plows and harrows finally all that does belong to me either in the house or without does to my dear & loving wife Margaret Minion and do make & constitute her my whole and sole Executrix to keep and enjoy all that is mine during her naturall life without disturbance or hindrance of any person what so ever and at her deceas to be left as the pleasure

unto my son Edward Gunter deposing all my just debts to be honestly paid & satisfied  
my soul bound to my master and redeemer my body I commit to the  
Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named  
Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Gunter one young Cow to provide  
he withal to change his life by the way of marriage by the last of May  
next But if not then a young heifer Item I give and bequeath unto my  
son Joseph Gunter one three year old heifer & a ewe Item I give & bequeath  
unto my daughter Sarah Gunter one two year old heifer & one ewe Item I give  
I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Collins one ewe Item I give & bequeath  
unto my daughter Thomas Collins one ewe Item I give & bequeath unto my son Edward Gunter my hand mill & Cartine after my death  
decease or marriage Item I give & bequeath unto my son William my  
Broad Ax & Iron Wedges after my wife's decease or marriage Item I give
