made this third day of June In the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Seventeen Between Richard Kettison and Mary his wife of the County of Accomack in the Colony of Virginia of the one part: and Mary Bayly of the said Colony of Virginia widow of Robert Bayly deceased of the other part: Witnesseth that I the said Richard Kettison with my wife: for theirs good causes and valuable Consideration, by us already Received: wee have Moved, have granted bargained sold confirmed Enforced assigned Allocated and Delivered unto the said Mary Bayly her heirs Executors Admrs and Assignes forever a parcel of Land containing one hundred Acres situate lying and being in the County of Accomack aforesaid near the head of Gargaphia branch: beginning at a marked Gum in a new branch: thence Running North west down the said branch one hundred and fifty poles: unto a marked Pine thence South west by a line of marked trees unto a marked Gum: thence North west unto the fork of the said branch: thence Southward by Eighty three degrees: westerly fifty eight poles: unto a corner marked Gum: Eastward from Thomas Crippen Land: thence along the said of the said Crippen by marked Gum North west fifty six poles unto a corner pine passing this from the said of the above said Bayly: thence North east one hundred and twenty six poles along the said of the said Land: unto the place where it first began it being part of the aforesaid Richard and Mary Kettison's fourteen hundred acres of Land To have and to hold the said one hundred Acres of Land with all houses Orchard Gardens fences: with all woods waters with privileges of fishing fowling and hunting with all profits Commodities and Priviledges whatsoever thereunto belonging unto v. said Mary Bayly her heirs Executors Admrs and Assignes: Against the Claim of v. the said Richard Kettison and Mary my wife: our heirs Executors Admrs or Assignes for ever: Warranting unto the said Mary Bayly her heirs and Assignes for ever quiet and peaceable possession of v. said one hundred Acres of Land with all the appertinances thereunto belonging: from the Claim trouble and
