 shall be thought fitting by my Exeentr after to be named & as for my worldly
 Estate which God of his mercy hath bin pleased to Give me after my debts
 are payed I Give & bequeath as followeth viz
 I Give & bequeath unto my son Phillip Parker all my Land & plantation att Nam
 Downe whereon I now dwell by Skimattin two hundred & twenty Acres & all my
 said & marsh y. I have in Maryland at a place called or known by the name of
 Run-bells marsh to him my son Phillip Parker and y. heirs of his body lawfully
 begotten for ever and for want of such heirs to s. next heir at Common Law Reserving
 to my loving wife y. use & benefit of all y. s. s. land till my s. s. son shall
 come to s. age of sixteen years & then only to have her third during her
 naturall life & then to my s. s. son & his heirs as afores. & my Exeentr too &
 all Carpenter tools & pibels & holsters; Item I Give & bequeath unto my daughter
 Mary Parker allis with my said in Maryland att Pocomoke near y. head of
 Pitts Creek Containing two hundred Acres more or less to her my s. s. daughter
 Mary & her heirs for ever & one negro called Daniel - Item I Give & bequeath
 unto my daughter Elizabeth Parker one hundred Acres of Land lying near Wa-
 = llops Road formerly bought of Thomas Smith y. s. s. land I Give unto my
 daughter Elizabeth & her heirs for ever & my Pele Skin Blank & one fether
 & a bolster & pare of Blankets. Item I Give & bequeath unto my loving
 wife a negro boy called Cain during her naturall life & after her death
 to my daughter Winifred Parker & her heirs for ever
 I Give & bequeath all the rest of my personall Estate after my death &
 Legacies are payed to be Equally divided between my loving wife & my
 son Phillip & my daughter Winifred immediately after my death &
 my will is y. my daughter Winifred may have priviledge allwaie
 during her naturall life to keep & pasture five head of Cattle in y. Marsh
 which I have Given to my son Phillip & heirs forever & my desire is y.
 Brother George Parker wd. Bookke Richard Rogers & Arthur Laylor s. s.
 my estate according to y. true y. best of the last will & Testament
 and lastly I Appoint & make my loving wife the sole & sole Exe. of
 this my last will & Testament Revoking all other wills or will made by
 me att any time or times whensoever doe by these presents declare
 this to be my last will & Testament as witness my hand & Seal this

 believing y. I shall receive pardon for all my sins by y. Merits and
 mercy of Jesus Christ my Lord & Saviour & my body to s. Earth
 from whence it was taken & for such words good as y. Lord in mercy
 hath showed one me: my meaning is y. y. same shall be bestowd
 & employed as hereafter named & mentioned

 and bounding by Ekkes Creek Containing one hundred Acres with all
 appurtenances belonging thereto belonging and also one Cowe and
 one mother and also five Sheepe to my s. mother
