Turnell over-Seers or Trustees to see this my will duly performed
according to the true intent and meaning thereof, and in confirm-

and blessing bestowed on me & considering with my self the uncertain-
ty of any life I do therefore make & appoint this to be my last
will & Testament Rescinding all other wills or wills by me formerly
made and first and principally I bequeath my soul to God the
Great Creator hoping & steadfastly believing through the mercy & bounti-
fulness of Jesus Christ to receive a full & free pardon for all my sins
and a place amongst the elect in Endless happiness & for what work
that the Lord in his Mercy hath bestowed on me I do order & be-
queath in manner following
I give & bequeath to my son Scarborough Drummond two Good Beds & fur-
niture fitt for them one to have Curtains & valances the other not
also give my son Scarborough twenty shillings. Item I give & be-
queath to my son Richard Drummond my Plantation house live on In-
land lying that half of half moon Island viz all of it & apart thereunto
belonging to him & his heirs for ever halfe give to my son Rich-
ard Negro (viz) Sumner Dick Hagar & Rapney to him & his heirs for
ever only the first Child that the Negro Hagar shall bring that
shall live to the age of two years I give & bequeath to my
Grandson Richard Drummond to him & his heirs lawfully begotten
of his body & my will is that if my Grandson should dye without
such issue as aforesaid that then I give the Child to my son Richard
& his heirs for ever halfe give to my son Richard my mill & all
the appurtenances thereunto belonging & Item I give & bequeath
to my Granddaughter Elizabeth Drummond my Negro Girl named Hunter to
her & her heirs lawfully begotten of her body but in case my aforesaid
Granddaughter should dye without such issue that then I give of
my Girl to my Grandson Richard & his heirs lawfully begotten & in

The my Grandson Richard should dye without issue I give & I give to my Grandson Spencer & his heirs for ever I also give to my Granddaughter Elizabeth the smallest Bed in of Hall Chamber & all the furniture thereunto belonging & a half a dozen of new powder dishes & a dozen new powder plates & a dozen of new pewter spoons & a pair of new Diapers bought of my son Rich and a piece of Good Latine Bought of Mr. William W. ells & a piece of fine Calico bought of Mr. Anderson Dabryngple. -- Here I Give to my son Richard and five Negro's more named as followeth (viz) Lawrence, Robin, Bandy, Bep & Benn to him & his heirs forever unless the Child that my Negro Bep goes wth I Give to my Grandson Spencer Drummond & his heirs Lawfully begotten of his body & they will is that my son Richard Drummond shall send my son Scarborough Rich necessary as he shall think convenient for his support & my will is also that if my son Scarborough should marry & have Lawfull issue that then my son Richard to pay a young Negro to each of three of his first Children when they shall come to 7. Age of two years or the 3 young Negro's to be of the same Age or thereabouts. -- Here I Give to my son Richard Drummond all my personal Estate he Lending to his brother Scarborough such of the same as he & my Brother will Drummond shall think necessary for him -- I do also constitute and appoint my Brother Will Drummond & my son Richard Drummond to be my whole & sole Executors to see this my will fully performed in all points according to the true Intent & meaning thereof all which Doe Confirm with my hand & seal this 24 day of February Anno. dⁿⁱ. 1720
