In the name of God. Amen I Robert Boll of Accomack County planter being an aged  
 person & taking into serious Consideration the frailty of this Mortal life & the certainty of  
 Death do hereby make my last Will & testament in manner & form following Viz  
 I Give & bequeath my Soul into the Hands of Almighty god who gave it & my body to  
 the Earth from whence it came to have a decent Christian Burial as for my worldly  
 Estate that god hath ben pleased to bestow upon me I Give & bequeath as hereafter  
 mentioned Viz

I Give & bequeath unto my loving Wife Mary Boll the plantation wherein I now dwell  
 with as much Land adjoining to it as may make up two hundred & fifty Acres of Land  
 during the time of her life & after her decease to my Son Thomas Boll & the heirs of his  
 body Lawfully begotten for ever & for want of such heirs as will be hereafter mentioned  
 in this my last Will but my will & pleasure is that my Son Thomas Boll may have Liberty  
 to sell or live any where on the two hundred & fifty Acres of Land above said in the time  
 of his Mothers life & not to molest or disturb her during the time of her widowhood

I Give & bequeath unto my Son William Boll two hundred & fifty Acres of Land situate  
 lying & being in Accomack County at the Head of my land whereon I now dwell to  
 begin at the line at the head of my Land as a said & to run from Crook to Crook to  
 wards the plantation whereon I now dwell to complete his said two hundred  
 & fifty Acres to him my said Son William Boll & to the heirs of his body lawfully begotten  
 forever Conditionally that he nor his heirs do not molest my Son Nathaniel C. Boll nor  
 his heirs of a parcel of Land which I shall give him at Kafwadox which was left to

I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Bole one hundred & fifty Acres of Land being the part of the Division of Land which I have deeded at the end of my land to begin at the point where his boundary from East to West to complete his said one hundred & fifty Acres of Land also my plantation at Newadoc with all the appurtenances thereof belonging to him my said son Nathaniel Bole & the heirs of his own body lawfully begotten for ever & for want such heirs as will be hereafter mentioned in this will & my will & pleasure is that if my son William Bole or his heirs shall at any time or times recover the land or lands which I have given my son Nathaniel Bole at Newadoc that then the Land given to my son William Bole to be my son Nathaniel Bole's & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever

I give & bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Bole a small parcel of Land which I bought of Thomas Maddux to him & his heirs during the time of his life & when he shall die from the said Thomas Maddux

I give & bequeath unto my granddaughter Tabitha Bole Daughter of Nathaniel & Mary Bole one Negro Girl named Leah with her increase to my said granddaughter Tabitha Bole to her & the lawful heirs of her body for ever

My Will & pleasure is that if any of these my three Sons to wit William Thomas Nathaniel Bole either of them die without issue then his part of Land to be equally divided between the survivors of my said Sons & altho my will & pleasure is that all these of my Sons have privilege to go to Timber on any part of my land at Matchipungo for the use of their respective plantations but not to dispose off

I give & bequeath all the rest of my Estate to my loving Wife Mary Bole during the time of her life & after her decease to be equally divided between my three Sons (viz) William Thomas & Nathaniel Bole further my will & pleasure is that there be neither Appraisment nor Inventory on my Estate & that my Wife nor the Court to have any further to do with it than to approve my Will but leaving it wholly to the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned I do hereby ordain constitute & appoint my three Sons to wit William Thomas Nathaniel Bole to be my whole & sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament but my will is that after my Wife's decease my Estate to her given to be divided into three parts by my three Sons & that my son Nathaniel Bole have his first choice of the said Estate both real & personal and I do hereby revoke all other wills or Wills by me made & do hereby own & declare this to be my last will & Testament in witness whereof I have signed with my hand and affix my seal this fourth day of October in the Year of our Lord God One thousand seven hundred & twenty four
