hath been pleased to give me I give & bestow as followeth, my will & devise is that

 herewith fully satisfied and contented in honor and of every part and parcel thereof do Lawfully
 and discharge Mason John Manning his heirs &c. and assigns for ever by these presents have given
 granted Bargained sold Alienated conveyed & confirmed and by these presents do fully sell and
 absolutely give grant bargain sell alien convey and confirm unto the said Peter Manning his heirs
 and assigns for ever one certain Massaugos tract of Land situate lying and being in
 Accomack County in the Colony of Virginia on the bay Side near the head of Pungotankue
