my son John y^e part y^t next to y^e head of y^e Branch not debarring
wife of her thirds I then I Give & bequeath unto my wife one third
part of my personall estate & all my hoggs & all y^e Cows & meat y^e y^e
y^e house all my Dec: & the other two thirds to be divided in to three small
parts & y^t my daughter Mary have one part & my daughter Dorcas
have one part & y^t one part be equally divided between my two sons
Arthur & John & my will is y^t my sons be at age for them selves at
eighteen years old kee their mother marry but if she Continue a widow
and I will y^t they till come to lawfull age & I make & appoint my
loving wife the Executrix of this my last will & Testament Revoking
all other will or wills made by me at any time or times whether
doe Rele & publish this to be my last will & Testament as witness my
hand this thirtieth day of January Anno Domini 1729

 Deposition of J. Collins aged thirty years of Eleventh day of August last
 past, I John Collins being at W. Buckling house of J. Albert named Alice
 Hayes & to Alice told me the then being sick & weak but of perfect
 sober memory & understanding to & best of my knowledge it was her
 desire that her little she was then possessed of & her share to her daughter
 Elizabeth, & if she desired me to take care of them & if she being sick
 in number until W.D. Elizabeth should marry but not with standing J.D.
 Alice had. She gave her said daughter full power & liberty to sell or other
 ways dispose of J.D. Cattle as she J.D. Elizabeth should think fitt, also
 the deponent declares if J.D. Alice said all of rest of her Estate she gave
 to her daughter Elizabeth, excepting her pewter & all her books & a
