Be it knowne unto all men by these presents that I George Middleton of w: said County Planter, for divers good causes and Considerations, me Rememb: moving and for settling and disposing of what Estate the Lord hath pleased to bless me withall, and for the Advantage of my Children after my Decease and that no Quarrell or Controversie might arise amongst them, Have given grant and by this my present deed of Gift, does give grant and Assigne unto my wellbelov'd Son and Daughter, Joseph Melson and Elizabeth, his wife one hundred and Eight Eight Acres of Land, Situate lying and being in Accomack County Aforesaid to and their Heires for ever as shall be expressed and further declared, First to and order that the Eldest son & Heir of my said Son and Daughter Joseph Melson have and possess w: one halfe or Moiety of w: said one hundred Eight Eight Acres of Land to him and his Heires for ever but in full view of such Heires to remain to w: next Lawfull Heir or Heires remaining or succeeding for ever, In Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and Seale this first day of November 1715

In the Name of God Amen this Day to wit the thirtysfirst day of June the 1715 I Thomas Bell of Accomack County in Virginia being sick in body but of good perfect memory thanks be to God for it, and Calling to remembrance w: uncertain Estate of this Transitory life and that all flesh must yeald unto Death when it shall please God to call we make Constitute and declare this my Last will and Testament in w:ner and form following revoking and annulling by these presents all will and Testament and Testaments heretofore by me made or declared either by word or writing and this only to be taken for my last will and Testament and none other and first being sorry from w: bottom of my heart for my sins past wth humbly desiring forgiveness for the same I give and Comitt my soul unto almighty God my Saviour and redeemer in whom and by w: merits of Christ death and passion I trust and believe to be saved and that my soul with my body at w: goodvall Day of Resurrection shall rise again in glory and through the merits of Christ people's and Inherit w: Kingdom of Heaven prepared for his Elect & Chosen and my body to be buried in such decent manner as it shall please my Executors hereafter named I leave well and truly paid by my Executors hereafter named to any person or persons shall I give to my son Elias Bell my plantation where I now live & one hundred and fiftie acres of Land thereunto belonging to him & his Heires for ever and I give to my son Joseph Bell the remainder part of my Land being one hundred and fiftie acres to him and to his Heires for ever and I give to my wife Sarah Bell the use of the hole and reasonably enjoy the hole for her need full use and for the remainder part of my Estate I give to my loving wife and to her Heires for ever I give to w: rest of my Children: viz: Thomas Bell Jun: Sarah Kelle Oliver Bell Edward Bell Mary hard each and Every one of them Twelve pence a piece and I appoint my true and tender wife to hold and sole Exec^{tr} of this my Last will and Testament Signed Sealed and pronounced in the presents of us Testes
