 Cary and his heirs for ever
 I give unto my son Edw^d, horse named Bragg.
 I give unto my son James, 1 ditto named Nepp
 I give unto daughter Mary Cary, Mare Boney and my will his that
 she give the first Cull unto her sister Sarah
 I give unto my daughter Mary one fether bed & Bouster and one payr
 shoes, 1 speckled Rugg - - -
 My will his that my son Edw^d Cary live with my friend Rich^d Kitson
 till he come of the age of twenty one
 My will his that my son James live with my friend Solomon Ewell
 till he come of the age of twenty one
 My will his that my daughter Mary live with my friend Elis Abbott
 till the age of sixteen
 over from the other side
 and then to be att age and Receive the Legacy that I bestowed upon her
 all the Remainder parte of my Estate I give unto my wife Margarett
 Cary of what kind so ever appointing her my whole and sole Execut^{ix}
 of this my Last will and Testament Revoking all others att witness
 my hande Leane the 24 day of January 1719/20 before Sines My will
 his that my son James have my best Shute of Cloe to be Deppo-
 sed on by my friend Solomon Ewell & the Money pay him when
 full of age

In the Name of God Amen this first day of May in the year of our
 Christ one thousand seven hundred & Nineteen I Thomas Stockly of Accomack
 County in J. County of Virginia Yeoman being sick & weak in Body but of sound mind
 & memory Thanks to Almighty God therefore I do make & ordain this my Last will &
 Testament in manner following Viz^l first & principally I comend my soul unto the
 hands of my gracious God and my body I comitt to the Earth therein to remain
 untill the Resurrection of the great day And as for such worldly goods where with
 it hath pleased God to bless me I dispose of the same in manner & form as follow-
 eth That is to say Imprimis I give & Bequeath to my Loving & Beloved Wife
 Hannah Stockly all my Estate & every part & parcel thereof to her own sole
 & proper use & behoof during her widowhood after my Decease for the mainte-
 nance of her self & children so that there be no unfull waste Comitted But
 in case my wife should marry again or Depart this Life w^{ch} may happen
 first Then & in such case I give & Bequeath all my said Estate as followeth
 To wit I give & Bequeath my Dwelling plantation unto my son Charles Stockly
 with the Land adjoining Beginning at the head of Appawamon Creek & so running
 up on the North side my mill branch to a line of marked trees across the
 Land to a dividing line between Nathaniel Tanshills Plantation & the said
 Branch to him & the heirs of his body lawfully begotten & surviving w^{ch} Decease
 of him my said son Charles Stockly And the residue & remaining parts
 of my Land I give & Bequeath unto my son John Stockly & the heirs of his body
 lawfully begotten & surviving the Decease of him my said son John Stockly
 But in case my son Charles aft^r should die without such heirs aft^r Then I give
