 1723. I William Bugorsbee of Accomack County Planter being very Sick & weak in body
 out of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mine
 y^e Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dy: I
 make y^e Ordain that my last will & Testament that is to say principally & first
 of all I give & recommend my Soul into y^e hands of God that gave it and for my body I
 commend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at y^e Dis-
 cretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at y^e Generall Resurrection I shall
 receive y^e Same again by y^e mighty power of God & as touching such worldly Estate
 where wth it hath pleased God to Bless me in this life I give devise & dispose of the
 Same in y^e following manner Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my loving
 wife all my Land and plantation which is within fence I say to have y^e use of it
 during her widowhood and to get her of any part thereof provided she take care
 of my Children other wife to have as y^e said Direct Item I give & bequeath my horse
 and mare to my wife Elizabeth and Children during her widowhood for y^e use of the
 Plantation Item I give and bequeath my Plantation after my wifes decease or at
 her Marriage to be divided between my two Children namely Isaac and George
 Bugorsbee Lately I give & bequeath all my Estate Except what is already mentioned
 to my wife for y^e use of my Plantation to bring up my Children Item I give
 & bequeath unto my Son William Bugorsbee one Shilling and to be at age Directly
 after my decease and to be Discharged I do desire that my wife be my sole and
 sole Executor of this my last will & Testament and I do utterly Disallow revoke dis-
 annul all & every other former Testaments wills Agreements Executors by me in any way
 before this time made willed & bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this & no other
 to be my last will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand
 & Seal y^e day & year above written
