Silis die with out issue y^e to y^e next highest heirt in Common Law) Item I give to Silis my brother my wearing apparrell Item I give my sister Mary my Christ & my pocket handkerchief
In the next place I give to my brother Silis my whole share of Tobacco at Mrs Mary Goreses as I also give my brother Silis four hundred & twenty three pounds of Tobacco y^e John or born owes me) and also doe hereby appoint my brother Silis sole executor of this my last will & Testament to him 2 bushels of Corn y^e In gillit. son John gillit & 8th (the paper) and in witness and Confirmation hereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this 11th day and year first above written
