taken to be buried in such Christian manner as to my executors here
after named shall seeme meet and convenient and for al such worthy
goods as the Lord in marcy hath lent me my will and meaning is
that the same shall be employed and bestowed as it is in this my
will here affter expressed --
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Francis five Sheep and one Cow & Calf
Item I give and bequeath unto my son William one cow & Calf and
two Sheep
Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph one cow and Calf and three
Sheep

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Jacob my land and plantation where
on I now dwel being 138 acres to be held and posse by him and his heirs
affinity for ever I doe alsoe give unto him one cow and a yearling
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sabyntha one Cow and a yearling
heifer and fourteene shillings and a fether bed and furnyture ---
Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margret four ewes and
one yearling heifer ---

I doe constitute and appoint my louing and wel beloved wife
marget to be sole and only executrix of this my last will
and Testament and hewring noe more to wright I desire
