 I Give & bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God of Gave it me & my body to the earth from whence it came by such Christian like burial as shall be thought fitting by my Executor after to be named & as for my worldly Goods after my debts are payed I Give or followeth viz
 I Give & bequeath that debt of labor milly owes me being about six hundred unto all his Children Equally Among them all
 I Give unto Labrah milly my young mare that is att Major Barlys the or her father paying him one hundred pounds of Tobacco at w. last of october for her pasturing I Give unto my son in law Edmund Shuler one all my wareing Cloathes & all furing & woolling I have; Item I Give unto Rufanah Shuler one riding mare but my will is that her Children each of them a Calt if w. d. mare should bring them
 I Give unto w. two daughters of my son in law Edmund Shuler one all my house hold goods Equally betwixen them to be delivered w. their father at w. day of their marriage & I Give all w. debts I have due to me to my son in law Edmund Shuler one, And I Appoint & make my son in law Edmund Shuler one the sole sole Executor of this my last will & Testament Reserving all other will or wills made by me att any time or times when soever doe publish & declare this to be my last will & Testament as witness my hand & Seal the 27th day of August & yeaere of our Lord 1720 the make of

In the name of God Amen 48th of 3rd day 1720 I John Tayler being sick in body but of sound & perfect memory thanks be to God for the same & knowing the uncertainty of this life beare on Earth I do by these presents make this my last will & Testament as followeth
 I Give & bequeath unto my son Robert one hundred Acres of land binding upon Hilby ones Pincock white & William miles to be held & possess by him & his heirs for Ever; Item I Give & bequeath unto my son Joseph my manner plantation whereon I now dwell containing one hundred Acres to be held & possess by him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for Ever
 I Give unto my son William one hundred Acres of land being upon the wafale side of Love Long branch & d. branch to be divided between him & my son Joseph & if he is wanting of hundred acres to goe over the branch upon the South side of moagne Road to make his Compliment which land I Give to him & his heirs for Ever; Item I Give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife & Consite of my plantation to my son Joseph arrive to the years of Eighteen & then the habe but her thirds; my will is if my son Joseph die out heirs lawfully begotten of his one body then my plantation to returne to my son Robert & his heirs for Ever; Item I Give & bequeath unto my Joseph one yearling horse one he had mill one set of wedges & grinstone gun & sword also I Give to my daughter Mary one feather bed & furnitures one Cow & Calt one horn pot one pulber dish one one plate his Spoon one Lamb one sow & pigs to be delivered to her at w. day of her marriage but if she dies before the marriage then to be Equally divided among my Children; Item all the rest of my Estate to my wife during the time of her widow hood & if my wife marrys to have a third part & d. Rest to be divided among all my Children also before the marriage to be Equally divided among all
