Year of our Lord 1727. I William Savage of Newmarket County being very ill
in body but of perfect mind & memory Thanks be given unto God, therefore
calling unto mind the mortality of my Body & knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die, I Do make & Ordain this my last will & Testament That
is to say principally & first of all, I give & recommend my soul into the hands of
God that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a
Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting
but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to
bless me with in this life, I give, Devise & Dispose of the same in following manner
Afterne.

Item. I give & bequeath to my son Parker Savage my house & plantation with
one hundred & fifty acres of land belong to it to him & his heirs for ever

Item. my will is that my son Parker gives my son William Savage Three

Thousand pound of Tobacco which he shall honestly pay.

Item. I give to my daughter Phigail Savage one Cow or Cows follow & one Sheep

Item. I give to my son William Savage one Cow or Cows follow & one Sheep and
one large peaced Dish and one Gobbin.

Item. I give to my Daughter Mary Savage one Cow or Cows follow & one Sheep

Item. I give to my son Parker Savage one Cow or Cows follow & one Sheep &
one Gun with Muskell Gun & my little Horse.

Item. After my Debt ~~is~~ paid & Legacies all the remaining part of my Estate
I give to my loving wife Abby Savage and also my will and desire is that
my wife should hold & possess the House & plantation wherof I now dwell
during the Time of her Widowhood.

Item. I do appoint my beloved wife to be whole & sole Executrix of this my
last will & Testament revoking all other Wills & Testaments formerly
made by me. In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seale the Day & Year above written
