Calling to mind & uncertainty of my life in this world and the certainty  
Leaving this world when it shall please God to call me and being desirous  
Settle of Estate w<sup>t</sup> it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with in the  
world; and for preventing future differences that may chance to arise between  
the same. Committing my body to the Earth decently to be buried at w<sup>t</sup> I desire  
of my friends or servants to hear after mentioned and my Immortal soul  
all mighty God in hopes of a glorious and blessed Resurrection unto eternal  
life through Jesus Christ my only Lord and Saviour hereby revoking all other  
wills & testaments here to fore and I do make & constitute and ordain this to  
my last will and testament In manner & forme following  
I give and bequeath my Immortal soul to God who gave it and my body to  
the Earth to be interred as above to  
I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son William Shephard Foster son of John &  
Elizabeth Foster my land and plantation lying & being in w<sup>t</sup> County of Accommack  
in the Colony aforesaid to him and of his heirs Lawfully begotten for in  
my will is the P<sup>t</sup> John and Elizabeth Foster have their lives part of them  
the above d<sup>r</sup> land given to their son during their natural lives upon such  
conditions as shall be hereafter mentioned / to w<sup>t</sup> if w<sup>t</sup> P<sup>t</sup> John & Elizabeth  
Foster shall well & decently and dutifully maintain my wife Mary my  
land with meat drink washing and lodging during her life and all other  
expenses suitable and fitting for her degree and condition with honeste roomes  
in all other matters than they to leave the Land & &c during their natural  
lives; but if the P<sup>t</sup> John and Elizabeth Foster shall prove base to my wife  
my decess to be made out according to w<sup>t</sup> judgment of my well beloved friend  
James Kempe or if he w<sup>t</sup> James Kempe shall be fit to turne them out  
the house and of my P<sup>t</sup> Land bequeathed as above I do give him  
power and authority to do  
I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid Grand Son William Shephard Foster to  
God and forever to be delivered to him at the age of twenty one years  
I leave my Trusty & well beloved friend James Kempe and his family his wife full  
power and authority to see y<sup>t</sup> my wife well taken care of during her nat-  
ural life that she may want nothing that is necessary for her to  
their one only Judgment and to take as they see fit out of my estate  
what they see fit for that purpose  
I give unto my P<sup>t</sup> Grand son William Shephard Foster six Ewes & six  
breeding does and my Bed that I my selfe lay on and all furniture  
to w<sup>t</sup> James son Iron potts and one frysing iron and all my planters  
Carpenters Tools one P<sup>t</sup> Groome moulder and one P<sup>t</sup> of Lard Mill Stones the  
last articles not to be removed of w<sup>t</sup> plantation  
I give to w<sup>t</sup> next child if shall be borne of the body of my daughter  
Elizabeth Foster three Ewes & my young horse now running in Bigg Point Marsh  
Jordan and a count Elizabeth Foster the wife of John Foster & w<sup>t</sup> John  
Foster Esq<sup>r</sup> & Executrix of this my last will & Testament not with-  
standing their Executrixship I give full power and authority unto my friend James  
Kempe to act and doe in all things as above mentioned and ther  
wills to be a law in all such cases without being called in question for  
what they see fit to do in Relation to w<sup>t</sup> maintenance of my wife  
out my Estate In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal  
this nineteenth of May 1718

This Indenture made the fifth day of October anno Domini one thousand  
seven hundred & eighteen between Edward Gascoyne & John Gascoyne of w<sup>t</sup> County of  
Acornack in the County of the Planters two of the sons of Henry Gascoyne late of  
Northampton County Planter Deceased of good estate and William Daniel of the  
County of Acornack Planter of w<sup>t</sup> other side whereas of d<sup>r</sup> Henry Gascoyne in his  
life was possessed in his Tenement of Hee of in and unto Eleven hundred acres of  
Land situate lying & being in w<sup>t</sup> County of Acornack aforesd near w<sup>t</sup> Head of Syngolden  
Creek and by his last will & Testament bearing date the first day of October one  
Thousand six hundred & Ninety amongst others things therein contained d<sup>r</sup> Henry left unto his  
son Henry Gascoyne all his Land, Livings & Tenements in Northampton County & to his  
Heirs lawfully begotten for ever and in case of d<sup>r</sup> Henry should depart this life without  
Issue lawfully begotten and before he came to w<sup>t</sup> age of one & twenty years  
that then his son William Gascoyne & his heirs should Inherit the same for ever &  
and w<sup>t</sup> Henry Gascoyne the father d<sup>r</sup> further by his d<sup>r</sup> last will & Testament devised  
and above d<sup>r</sup> Eleven hundred acres of Land and unto his son William Thomas & John  
Gascoyne & to their heirs for ever on Condition nevertheless in case his son  
Henry should depart this life before he came to w<sup>t</sup> age of one & twenty years  
lawfully begotten that then his son William being to succeed him in inheritance of  
the Estate aforesd w<sup>t</sup> William & his heirs should be免ed from Injoying  
any pte of the d<sup>r</sup> Eleven hundred acres of Land in Acornack County but t<sup>r</sup>  
Lease hold be & remains to his d<sup>r</sup> losses Thomas & John & their heirs Equally Divi-  
ded as w<sup>t</sup> will d<sup>r</sup> Henry Gascoyne & son is lately late before he came to w<sup>t</sup> age of  
one & twenty years lawfully begotten as aforesd by reason whereof w<sup>t</sup> William  
& John Gascoyne & their heirs should be免ed from Injoying  
any pte of the d<sup>r</sup> Eleven hundred acres of Land by vertue of w<sup>t</sup> Bequest aforesd  
of d<sup>r</sup> & unto w<sup>t</sup> aforesd Eleven hundred acres of Land by vertue of w<sup>t</sup> Bequest aforesd  
hereby released in w<sup>t</sup> aforesd Thomas & John & their heirs Equally to be Divided  
to Thomas & John now are in the actual possession & Liege of w<sup>t</sup> same Now this  
Indenture witnesseth that w<sup>t</sup> Thomas & John Gascoyne for & in Consideration  
of d<sup>r</sup> full & just quantity of ten thousand pounds of Tobacco to them in hand  
paid by the aforesd William Daniel before d<sup>r</sup> Entailing & delivery hereof &  
receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge & thereof & of every pte & part  
thereof do acquitt & discharge w<sup>t</sup> William Daniel his heirs & assigns  
w<sup>t</sup> & assigns for ever by these presents have granted bargained sold aliened  
Entailed & Confirmed and by these presents for themselves their heirs &  
assigns do grant Bargain sell alien Entail & Confirm unto w<sup>t</sup> William  
Daniel his heirs & assigns for ever a certain tract of Land contain-  
ing one hundred twenty four acres being pte of d<sup>r</sup> Eleven hundred  
Acres and is cutted & bounded as followeth Bounded on w<sup>t</sup> south East on  
M<sup>r</sup> James Watt his land North Easterly on Michael Nees land North  
Westerly on D<sup>r</sup> Joynes his land Southerly on Charles Taylors land Drawn  
with poles & corners as followeth first beginning at a corner tree near w<sup>t</sup> base  
the corner of an old field commonly called Gascoynes old field thence running North  
East by North two hundred & six poles thence North west by west one  
hundred Ninety six poles thence South two hundred & six poles thence  
South East one hundred & four poles to w<sup>t</sup> first mentioned corner  
together with all & singular the buildings fences orchards
