In the name of God amen I Argoll Hermanson being at present in a weak state of body but sound in mind thanks be to God, therefore I ^{doe} make this my last will & Testam^t as followeth
Viz^t Imp^s I give & bequesth to my second Son Benjamin Hermanson & the heirs of his body Lawfully begotten for Ever my right of the Land on which my Father George Hermanson now liveth being Six Hundred Acres I give & bequesth to my Eldest Son George Hermanson for ever the fee Simple of that hundred Acres of Land that belonged formerly to Henry Pike & now belonging to Gatterude Hermanson I leave the Negroe Wench Kate & her Encrease to be Equally divided betwixt my two Sons above menconed so soon as my second son Benjamin is at Eighteen years of Age. I Give unto my Son Benjamin the Silver Dish when he is at eighteen Years of age. My will & desire is that each of my sons above menconed have a Bedd & furniture. I likewise desire that each of my sons above menconed may have four pewter plates one Iron Pott & one doz. of plates. I give unto my loving Wife Barbere Hermanson the Negroe man Dublin at her own disposall & all the Rest of my Estate be it in what sort it will she may do therewith or divide as best pleaseth her for the better bringing up & taking care of my children above mentioned. My will is that my Estate be not brought to an Appraisement & I leave my wife Executrix given under my hand & Seel before these witnesses undernesth.
