

In the Name of God amen the 4th day of aprile 1736/ I Argol Yardly West being sick & Weak in Body but of perfect sense & memory Do make & ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in manner & form following (Viz) first I recomend my soul into the hands of God that gave it & my body to the Karth from whence it came & for what Worldly Estate wherewith it hath plessed God to bestow on me I dispose of as followeth Item I give & bequeath unto my son John West my plantatⁿ whereon I now live with all the Land belonging thereto to him the said John & his Lawfull heirs for ever but my will & desire is y^t my Loving Wife may have the use & profits of all my Land so long as she remains a Widdow Item all the remainder part of my Estate my Will & desire is that my Loving wife may have the use & benefit of so Long as she remains a Widdow & at her death or Marriage to be equally divided between my two daughters Sarah Yardly & Ann West my desire is that no appraisem^t may be on my Estate Lastly I appoint my loving Wife Comfort West whole & Sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament revoking all other Wills & Testaments made by me Whereunto I have set my hand & Seal
