

In the name of God amen this Klevelandth day of October in the Year of our Lord 1724 I Charles Ashby of Accomack County in the Dominion of Virginia being of good & perfect remembrance thanks be to Almighty God & knowing that I am naturally born to die and to pass from this mortall world and transitory life and minding to put in order as well all my Singular goods and Chattles & also whatsoever Debt or Debts is to me owing as also to Declare how I have bestowed my Lands and Tenements to the intent there should be no Strife for the Same after my Decease do therefore first of all desire my Children & all others to be contented with this my last will and Testament without any trouble or Vexation whatsoever by word writing or otherways and to Avoid all occasion of Charges I revoke and renounce all former and other wills & Tenements whatsoever by word writing or otherwise and make and ordain this to be my only last will and Testament in manner and form following First I comend my Soul to Almighty God & to his Jesus Christ my Saviour and Redeemer beseeching the most holy and blessed Trinity to have mercy on my Soul and to pardon and forgive me all my Sins & offences so that I may after this mutable Life arise with the elect through the Death & passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to his mercifull promise in that behalf & I will that this my body after my Decease be Decently buried by the discretion of my Executors herein Nominated. Item I do order that whatsoever Debt or Debts I owe may be paid as also whatsoever debts to me due may also be paid Item I give and bequesth to my youngest Son Charles Ashby my now dwelling Plantation containing One hundred Acres of Land with all houses and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to him and his heirs male lawfully begotten for ever Item I give and bequesth to my Daughter Kleanor Ashby One feather bed and covering to her and her heirs for ever Lastly I do hereby ordain & Constitute my loving wife Sarah Ashby

Plantation containing One hundred Acres of Land with all houses and appurtenances thereunto
belonging or in any wise appertaining to him and his heirs male lawfully begotten for ever
Item I give and bequesth to my Daughter Kleenor Ashly one feather bed and covering to her
and her heirs for ever Lastly I do hereby orasein & Constitute my Loving wife Sarah Ashby
together with my Son Charles Ashly to be my whole Sole Executrix and executor of all and
Singular my Goods & Chattles and all other things which God hath been pleased to Endow me
with all and more Especially of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have
hereunto Sett my hand & Seal the day and year above written
