decently interr'd at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named. Item I give to

give her the privilege of Sowing yearly a peck of flax Seed & raising fowl & such other  
necessary privilege as my said wife shall see proper & requisite & these privileges  
to continue to her no longer then during my said wifes pleasure & after my said wifes  
death I give the s<sup>d</sup> Land & plantation to the Eldest daughter of the said Rhoda the  
wife of William Chance & the heirs of her body lawfully begotten for ever & for want of  
such to Mary Daniel the daughter of William Daniel & Mary his wife & her heirs for ever  
& if the said Eldest daughter of the said Rhoda who is now unbaptiz'd & who I desire may  
be named Margerett should be under the Age of twenty one years or unmarried at my said  
Wifes death I appoint her mother the said Rhoda if she shall at that time be a widow or her  
present husband dead & not otherwise to receive the profitts of the same till her said  
daughter comes to full Age or marries w<sup>th</sup>out account for the same but if the said Chance
