Dispose of them as followeth wis: Item I give and bequeath unto my friend John Shaphard my Dun horse bridle and Saddle my new Shoes Item I give unto Arnol siderson Ugrahon Two Iron wedges now in possession of Brandon Fletcher and to Remain in his Custody till Arnol Comes to Twenty Years of age elso I give to Arnol my old Duroy Cost and Britches my old hatt I tem I give to Matthew Perish four busheles of Corn Item efter my Debts are paid and all Charge my will is that the Remainder of my Estate be Sold by my Executor for Indian Corn and he to pay it to my Mother Mergret Ozburn et his Discretion Yearly and if my Mother Should die before it all be Expended 1 Give it all to my friend John Shephard Lately I do appoint my friend John Shephard to be my Sole Executor Revoking all other wills before by me mede November ye 20th Day 1736
