praised be God doe make & ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following.
First I bequesth my Soul unto the hands of Almighty God my maker hoping that thro the
meritorious death & passion of Jesus Christ my only Saviour & Redeemer to receive free
pardon & forgiveness of all my Sins & as for my Body to be buried in Christian burial at
the discretion of my Execut^r hereafter nominated Item I give & bequesth to my son John
Linsey my plantation were I now live & all my land on the North side of the road leads from

where my berris now stands unto John Stantons pasture it being part of the dividend or
parcell of land given me by a deed of Gift made by my father John Jenkins deced also in-
cluding the piny old field that lyes Just without my berris as ferr as a Cross line runing
from the s^d road to the south

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Branch of my land the like runing about North East & South West to him & his heirs lawfully
begotten of his body for ever Excepting ffifty Acres on the North branch I give to my dau-
ghter Elizébeth Guy during her naturall life & after her deceasse to fell to my son John
Linsey & further I give to my son John Linsey all my plows harrows Axes hoes pistolls houl-
sters Gun & horse & further I give to my son John Linsey one feather bedd & such furniture
as is to it & further I doe will & ordain that his two sisters Catherine & Margeret Linsey
shall have their living with him till they Marry always provided & it is my will that they
work as they doe now for me & further I do will & ordain my son James Linsey in the care of
my son John Linsey his brother & to give him one years Schooling & if my son John Linsey
should die without Issue then my plantation of land to fell to my son James Linsey Item
I give & bequeath to my son James Binsey all the rest of my dividend of Land lying on
the south side of the s^d road to the south branch of my land & from the Cross line
by the piny old field to the upper end of my land to him & his heirs lawfully begotten of
his body forever & further I give to my son James Linsey one horse & one Gun when he comes
to the Age of Eighteen Years Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizébeth Guy one
young heifer & one box Iron Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Catherine Linsey one
Cow & Calf & one feather bedd & such furniture as is to it & one Winnen Wheel Item
I give & bequeath to my daughter Margerett Linsey two Cows & Calves & one feather bedd
& such furniture as is to it & one Woollen Wheel Item I give one mare called Buck

til he comes to Age of twenty one Years Lastly I appoint my Son John Linsey my Execut^r

of this my last Will & Testament disallowing of all other Wills & Testaments whereof I

have hereunto set my hand & Seal the day & Year above Written.
