I Garrison Milby of Accomack County being weak of body but of perfect Sences blessed be God for it first and formost: I Give my Soul to Almighty God who Gave it to me and my Body to the Earth from whence it Came: I Give to my Loving brother John Milby my riding horse also my Desire is that the Rest of my Estate Should be Equally Divided between my brother John Milby and my three Sisters and my Brother Lathiel Milby's Son John Milby but in Case my brother Lathiel Milbys Son John Milby Doth Inherrit the Land whereon his mother now Liveth then his two Sisters namely Ann & Mary Milby to Inherit his part Left by his unkle Garison Milby: Also my will and Desire is that my Loving brother John Milby Shall be my whole and Sole Executor of this my Last will and Testament: as Witness my hand and seal this Day and year above Written
