

In the Name of God Amen I George Parker of Accomack County being weak of body but in perfect mind & memory doe make & ordain this my last Will & Testament first & principally I bequeath my Soul to God who gave it me & my body to the Earth to be decently Interr'd by my Execut^s hereafter menconed & as to my worldly Estate doe give & bequeath it as followeth (Viz^t) Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife the one half of this plantation whereon I now live & half of all the Improvements thereon wth half the orchard & half the use of the Still & also half of all the Marsh down the Neck & all the Stock Except what's hereafter given & also all my Negroes during her Widowhood to bring up

the Children & to Educate them & also to pay w^t debts I owe in right to any one but if my wife should Marry then she to have but one third of my Estate before menconed & the remssinder to be Equally divided between my Children Viz^t Ann Sarah Prissilla, Betty, Levin, Jn^o, Charles & Clement I also give unto my wife all the household Goods as sfs^d & if she Marry then to be divided among the Children sfs^d in manner & form as sfs^d

Levin, Jn^o, Charles & Clement I also give unto my wife all the household Goods as aforesaid
& if she ~~shd~~ ^{die} ~~Marry~~ ^{then} to be divided among the Children aforesaid in manner & form as aforesaid
2^d I give to my Son Geo after his mothers decease all my lands & Marsh whereon I now live
Except four hundred Acres where Mr Wats now lives on beginning at the head of back Creek
so running up as the neck Fence now runs so a Cross from the neck fence to the head line
to include four hundred Acres w^{ch} I to my Son John & his heirs and if my Son Geo should
Dye without Lawfull Issue then the land given to him to be Equally divided between John
Charles & Clement my three Sons. I also give my Son Geo. three Cows and Calves & ten
head of Sheep & half the^d still as long as his Mother lives & after her decease the
w^{ole} still. I give and bequesth unto my Son Tho^s and his heirs for Ever three hundred
Acres of Land on Pocomoke three Cows & Calves & ten head of sheep 4th I give and
bequesth to my Son Levin & his heirs one hundred & forty Acres of Land on Pocomoke being
part of the same tract I gave his bro^r Thomas. I give my Son John Liberty to keep
twenty head of Cattle in the Neck. 5th I give to my daught^r Ann after her Mothers
decease or after she Marry's my Negro Boy Joe. 6th I give to my daugh^r Sarah after her
mothers decease or after her marriage my Negro Girl Rachel. 7th I give unto my daugh^r
Priscilla after as aboves^d my Negroe Boy Called Ben 8th I give to Betty the first
Child thats born of the Negroe Woman Called Sarah 9th And if the above Negroe woman should
have any more Children after that should live I give one to Charles & another to Clement.
10th After my wifes decease I give my Negroe Peter to my son Charles and my Negroe Sarah
to my Son Clement Lastly I Appoint my loving Wife & my son Geo and Mr Geo. Dashaule
Execut^s to this my last will & Testament revoking by these presents all others by me made
heretofore & doe Declare this and no other Witness my hand & Seal this 26th day 7^{br}
