This Indenture made this Second Day of February in the year of our Lord one Thousand:
 Seven hundred and Thirty and in the fourth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George
 by the Grace of God of Great Brittain France and Ireland King Defender of the faith &c.^o
 Between Richard Kellam of the County of Accomeck in the Collony of Virginia of the one
 part and William Kellam of the same County of the other part Witnesseth That the said
 Richard Kellam for and in Consideration of the Natural Love and affection that he hath
 for his Son William Kellam hath given Granted enfeofed and Confirmed Likewise by these
 presents do give Grant Alien enfeof and Confirm unto the said William Kellam and his
 heirs forever a Certsin Tract or percell of Land Scituate lying in Accomeck County near
 Occomeck Creek called by the Name of Clems Containing Two hundred acres being the
 Southermost part of a Tract of four hundred acres with all buildings orchards houses
