on me I give and bequeath in manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath to my loving son Heli Bagwell the Land & Plantation whereon
I now Live with all the Appurtenances thereto belonging it being by Estimation fifty
Acres it being the Land Devised to me by the last will & Testament of my Deceased
Father Henry Bagwell & said to be fifty Acres more or less to him my said Son and his
heirs and Assigns for Ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my said Son Heli Bagwell & his heirs & Assigns for ever all
that part of Marsh and Hammock lying on the south side of a Gutt Running out of the Bay
into France Creek it being by Estimation one hundred Acres be the same more or less it
being the marsh and Hammock Devised to me by my abovesaid Father.

the decease of my Mother in Law Margaret Bagwell) all the remaining part of my Land it
being the Land & Plantation Devised to my Said Mother in Law during her life and the

imation one hundred and fifty Acres be the Same more or less.

for Ever the water mill bequeathed to me by my said Father

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after the decease of my said Mother in Law with the appurtenances thereto belonging.
Item I give and bequeath to each of my said Sons Heli and Spencer one feather bed and
furniture. Item I give and bequeath to my son Spencer one Cow and Calf Item I
give and bequeath to my loving Wife Sabra all the remaining part of my Estate not before
mentioned Also my will and desire is that my said wife have the care and tuition of my
said Sons Spencer and Heli with the profits and benefits of their Estates to support,
and Educate them till they arrive at Lawfull age Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving
wife Sabra my whole and sole executrix of this my last will & Testament Revoking all other
