and memory call to mind that it is once appointed for all men to die Thought fitt to
make this my Last will & Testament in manner and form as followeth first I give & bequeath
my soul into the hands of God who gave it hoping in and Through his mercoys to Receive
Eternal Life & as for my Body I Commend to the Earth to be buried at the Discretion of
my Friends - Imprimis I give & bequeath unto my Son James Longo my Plantation I now live
on Concludeing Seventy acres to him & his heirs male or Female Lawfully begotten by his
Body or if should think fitt to sell it on purpose to Raise money to purchase a better
Item I Give to my Daughter Mary Hutten the Land & Plantation whereon Pratt formerly
Lived on with Seventy acres to her and her heirs male or Female Lawfully begotten of her

Body or if she should think fitt to Sell it on purpose to purchase a better I Grant her the Liberty Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Longo Seventy acres of Land known by fox Ridge to her & her heirs Lawfully begotten of her body male or Female or if she should Sell it on purpose to purchase a better If there be not So much Land as I have given then my will is that it be Equally divided according to my Conveyance if either of my Daughters should dye without heirs or Selling then to tall to my son James Longo & his heirs forever I give & bequeath to my Son James Longo my Largest pair of hand Irons & all my Carpenters Toolcs & all my wearing Cloaths. I give to my Daughter Mary Hutten my Smallest pair of hand Irons & one white mare Commonly called hers I give to my Daughter Elizebeth my Spitt & Dripping pan & my mare Colt and as for all the remainder of my Estate I give to my beloved wife during her life or Widdowhood & after her Death to be equally Divided Between my three Children Viz^t James & Mary & Elizebeth I do make and ordain my dearly beloved wife Issbell Longo & Daughters Mary Hutten & Elizebeth Longo my whole & Sole Executrices of this my Last will & Testament Revoskeing all other wills before me made Each of them to be aiding and assisting each other as witness my hand and Seale this the 13th of August 1729 -
