

John Jackson's Will In the Name of God Amen I John Jackson of Accomack County in Virginia being at present very Sick and Weak of Body but of Sound mind praised be God for the Same Do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following Imprimis I bequesth my Soul to God Who Gave it and my Body to the Earth to be buried at the Discretion of my Executrix hereafter nominated Item all my Whole Estate of What Nature ^{OR} Kind soever real & personal I Lend to my Dear Wife She to have the Sole Use and Management of it During her Widowhood for Own and Childrens maintenance and at her Day of Marriage or Death to be Divided Amongst her Self and my Three Children William Elizebeth and Anna Item I give to my Daughter Jane Sneed the Wife of John Sneed one English Shilling Item I appoint my Wife Mary Jackson my Whole and Sole Executrix and I Desire She may not have my Estate appraised nor be Obligated to give any Security In Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 19th Day of February 1735)
