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In the name of God Amen according to the Computation of the Church of England I John Murray of Summersett County and province of Maryland Merch^t being of Sound mind & memory thanks be to God but very Sick & weak and knowing that it is allotted for all men Once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. Vizt Imprimis I bequeath my Soul into hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body to the Earth or See to be bury'd after the discretion of my Executors hereafter nominated Item I give unto my well beloved friend Hannah Henderson of the City of Philadelphia the Sum of fifty pounds Philadelphia currency Item I leave all my Estate both real and personall to the care and management of my well beloved friends Vizt Cap^t John Walker of Somersett County in Maryland & M^r Geo: Dougles of Accomack County in Virginia they the said Walker and said Dougles to Act as my Attorney's for my Estate in behalf and for the use of my honoured father George Murray or his heirs Executors Administrators or Assigns they the said Walker and Dougles paying all my just debts out of my said Estate and Receiving all Such debts as are due unto me as Shall appear by Books and other wriftings which are lodged in the hands of M^r Geo: Parker of Accomack County aforesaid together with Sundry goods and Merchandise to me belonging as also in the hands of Mrs Barbera Hermon Some goods and Merchandise to me belonging I also desire that all Such goods and Merchandise as are left unsold may not be brought to any Publick appraisement but an Inventory taken and the said goods Sold to the best advantage I therefore acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament Revoking all other Wills or deeds by me made heretofore In Witness whereof I hereunto Set my hand and Seal this 19th day of September Anno Dom^m 1736
