I John Patrick of Accomack County in Colony of Virginia overseer being very sick & weak of Body but of perfect Sense & memory Thanks be to Almighty God for the same & knowing that it is appointed once for all Men to die Do make & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & Form following First I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God my Maker & my Body to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner & my worldly goods as followeth. Item I Give unto my Mother Klizabeth Patrick my sorrell Mare & four pounds in Cash & my little Chest & all that is in it & two Head of Cattle that is at William Watts's Also I Give unto my Mother forty pounds of feathers one Iron pott & one pewter Dish that is at Charles Vanelsons & all my wearing Cloaths made & unmade. Item I Give unto my Land Lady Klizabeth Abbott my black Mare Saddle & bridle. Item I Give unto Mason Abbott one thousand covering Nails at Charles Vanelsons. Item I Give unto William Crippen the Son of my Landlady Kliz^a Abbott one Heifer at Mason Abbotts. Item I Give unto my said Mother one Cow at Mason Abbotts. Item I also Give unto my said Mother one large pine Chest at Mason Abbotts & a pair of Cotton Blanketts at William Watts. Item I ordain & appoint this to be my last will & testament revoking all others heretofore by me made. Item I ordain constitute & appoint Mason Abbott to be my whole & sole Executor to this my last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I Have hereunto set my Hand & Seal.
