Ordein this my Last Will and Testament ffirst & principally I committ my soul to Almighty God in hopes of a Certain & sure Resurrection to Everlasting life 2^{dly} I commit my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Desently interred by my Ext^{rs} hereafter mentioned and as for my Worldly Estate which has pleased God to Bestow upon me I Give & Bequesth as followeth Viz:

Imp^{rs} I Give & Bequesth to my Cozⁿ George Harmanson son of Argill Harmanson all the Land from Oyster sheall Gut to the Maryland Line Including that, that was Bowman Littleton in it: With all Houses Croherds fencings & Appertenances thereunto Belonging to him & his Heirs lawfully Begotten of his Body for Ever & also I Give Halfe of the Maryland Land belonging to me Bounding on the plantation to y^e Above^d George Harmanson to him & his heirs Lawfully Begotten of his Body for Ever; I also Give to the Above s^d George Harmanson a Silver Cup in the shape of a Glass.

Item I Give & Bequesth to my Sister Esther Littleton Robins all the Land that is in Virginia & Maryland Belonging to me that is not Already Given to her & her heirs for Ever Lawfully Begotten of her body I Also Give my Above said Sister a Bed & furnature my desire is that my sister Esther should have her home at my Dwelling house free During her Virginity.

Item I Give & Bequesth to my Sister Barbara Harmanson a Large Bed Called the Great Bed & furnature thereunto Belonging.

Item I Give & Bequesth to my Sister Esther Littleton Robins a Large Brass Kettle & a

Grest Iron pot & one p^s of Callico & one p^s of scotch Cloath & one p^s of Garlick and

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Likewise Another p^s of Scotch Cloath.
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Item I Give & Bequesth to Argill Hermanson two p^s of Scotch Cloath & one p^s of Irish Linning & onep^s of Duroys; & a Remnant of Broad Cloath & a Couch & Grest Table and Cubbord & one Dozⁿ of New pewter spoons & one Dozⁿ of pewter plates two new pewter Basons & five pewter Dishes & Likewise a New pewter Cann.

Item I Give & Bequesth to Sister Esther Littleton Robins five pewter Dishes & five pewter Basons one Dozⁿ of New pewter plates & one Dozⁿ of New Pewter Spoons & one pewter Salt Celler & 1 Silver spoon & one p^s of Sheeting Linning & one Bed Tick & one Brass Skillit & Likewise two Cows and two four Year old Steers.

Item I Give & Bequesth to Argill Hermanson & his Wife Barbara Hermanson my Water Mill to them & their Heirs Lawfully Begotten of their Body for Ever & also I Give my man James Carter and his Wife frank to the Above s^d Argill Hermanson & his wife Barbara Hermanson to them & their Heirs Lawfully Begotten of their Body for Ever and also I Give my horse Called Prince Bridle & Saddle & one working Mare & two Work Horses with plows & Harrows all for the use of the Aforementioned Plantation.

* Item I Will that all the rest of my Personall Estate that is not already Given be Equally Divided Between my Brother Argill Hermanson & my sister Littleton Robins and also I Desire that my Estate should not Come to Appraisment.

Lastly I Doe Nominete & Appoint my Brother Argill Hermanson & Sister Esther Littleton Robins Executor & Executrix of this my last will & Testament I do Disallow and make Void all other wills formerly made and make this my Last will & Testament Witness
