Seventeen hundred & Thirty I Richard Cutler of the County of Accomack Wsver being in  
health & perfect Memory thanks be given unto God for it Calling unto mind the Mortality  
of my Body Do make & Ordain this my Last Will & Testam<sup>t</sup> that is to Set ffirst I Give &  
Bequeath my Soul to God that gave it & my body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian  
like Manner at the Discret<sup>n</sup> of my Exec<sup>rs</sup> & touching Such Worldly Estate ss it hath  
Plesed God to bless me An this Life I Give & Bequeath in the ffollowing fform & Manner  
Imprimis I Give & Bequeath unto my two Sons George & Willism Cutler & their Heirs for Ever  
After my Decease the Plantation I now live on Containing three hundred acres of Land to be  
Equally Divided between them Always Provided & it is my Will that my Son George & his Heirs  
for Ever shell have the Mennor Plantation Whereon I now Live & So much of the Land next  
adjacent thereto ss shall make up One hundred & fifty Acres of Land I also Give &  
Bequeath to my Son George Cutler one Loom three Sets of Sleys & Geers & what I have  
fformerly Given I Confirm unto him Item I Give & Bequeath unto my Son Richard Cutler &  
his heirs for Ever One hundred & fifty acres of Land in the fforked Beck that I bought of  
Charles Leatherbury & also one feather bed & ffurniture one large Chest one Iron Pot  
one Bell Mettle Skillet I also give unto my Son Richard One Pair of Cullen Mill Stones  
with my other Loom & all the Rest of my Geers & Sleys Item I Give & Bequeath unto my  
Son John Cutler & his Heirs for Ever One hundred Acres of Land wh I bought of W<sup>m</sup> Lewis  
with my Lot of Land & House in the Town of Crancock I also give unto my Son John one  
feather Bed & ffurniture one Chest one large Cupboard one Iron Pot Item I Give &  
Bequeath unto my Son W<sup>m</sup> Cutler besides the land before given One feather Bed & ffurniture  
One Pair of Cullen Mill Stones one Chest One Iron Pot & a large brass Kettle Item I  
Give to my Daughter Mary Roberts one Silver Spoon Item I ffurther Give & Bequeath unto my

Bequeath unto my Son W<sup>m</sup> Cutler besides the Land before given One feather Bed & ffurniture

One Pail of Cullen Hill Stones one Chest One Iron Pot & a large brass Kettle Item I

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Give to my Daughter Mary Roberts one Silver Spoon Item I ffurther Give & Bequeath unto my  
Granddaughter Sned one ffether Bed & what ffurniture can be Sper'd one Smal1 black Trunk  
& one Iron Pot Item I Give & Bequeath what Sheep & Cattle I have unto my ffive Children  
that is to say Mary George Richard John & Willism it is also my Will that my three Sons  
Richard John & Willism have their Priviledge of Living here with their Ferts of the  
Orchard & Pasture During their Pleasure Provided they Do not Marry also my Negroe Women  
Bess to live among them while they Continue together & also it is my Will that if they  
Marry or Separate the S<sup>d</sup> Negroe Women Shall be my Daughter Mary Roberts & her heirs I  
Do give the Use of my Still unto all my Children that will come to it with their own  
Proper Effects & not Others & ffurthermore I Give the Rest of my Personall Estate to be  
Equally Divided between my three Sons Richard John & W<sup>m</sup> Cutler Excepting one old large  
brass kettle One Silver Spoon to my Son George & also one Silver Spoon to Each of my  
three Sons Richard John & Willism this is my Will also that no Part of my Estate Shall  
Come to an appreisement Lastly I appoint my Sons Richard & John Execu<sup>r</sup>s of this my  
Last Will & Testament & ffurthermore this my Last Will Dissallowing & Revoking all other  
fformer Wills In Witness Whereof I have hereunto Set my Hand & Seal the Day & Year above  
Written.
