Imprimis I give and bequeeth unto my well beloved wife Frances Savage my Land and Plantation whereon I Live with all houses and Orchards and all other profitts of Land thereunto belonging of the whole four hundred & fifty acres to her and her heirs four ever also I give to my well beloved wife my Two Negroes Dick and Robin with all other of my Estate real or personell wheresoever to be found further I give to my wife all my Horses, Cattle, Sheep hoggs & all Goods & Chattles that I at this present am possest with Further I do make and appoint my well Beloved wife to be my whole & Sole Executrix of this my Last will & Testament Revoaking all others before made In Witness whereunto I have Set my hand and Seel this the Seventh of October one Thousand Seven hundred & Twenty Nine.
