In the name of God amen I Ralph Justice of the County of Accomack being Sick and Weak of Body but of Sound and perfect memory thanks be unto God for the same do appoint this to be my Last will & Testament Revoking all other Will or Wills whatsoever appointing my ~~Wife~~ as followeth. (It) Imprimis I bequeath my Soul to God that gave it and my body to the Earth from whence it came & my body to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors Item I give unto my Son Rich<sup>d</sup> Justice my dwelling plantation and Six hundred acres Land thereto belonging to him and his heirs forever after the Death of his Mother I also give unto my said Son two hundred Acres of Land & Marsh which I leased of Thomas Hope for the Term of the Lease also three Negroes named Squacha Simon Sophia and one Still & one hand mill Item I give unto my Son Robert Justice three hundred acres of Land and marsh Where he now lives during his life and after his death unto his Son Richard and his heirs forever, also I give unto my said Son Robert Two Negroes named Manuel: Jo: Item I give unto my Daughter Eliz: Johnson two Negroes named old Betty & Peter to her and her heirs forever Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Kitson two negroes named Bridgett & Tony during her life and after her decease my will is that Bridget and her increase go unto my Grand Daughter Mary Farramore and her heirs Item I give unto my Daughter Mary Baker one Shilling Sterling Item I give unto my Grandson Richard Bundick one Negro Woman Called Jane Item I give unto my grandson Abbot Bundick one Negro Girl
