& Lambs I give & bequeath to my son in New Jeodian sell & Sarah his wife a piece of Land
& Marsh lying & bounded as followeth bounded southerly on the Land of West Kellum &
bounded Westerly on a line of mark't trees Northerly on the head of the Creek Roed &
bounded on the Land he now possesses being by computation Ten Acres more or less to them
& their heirs for ever & also a priveledge for them at my usual lading to make use on in
necessary manner during their natural lives I Give & Bequeath to my son Fisher Bradford
the plantation whereon I now live with Six hundred acres of Land belonging to it to him

This indenture made the second day of June Anno Domini Seventeen hundred
thirty & six between Thomas Preeson of the County of Northampton in Virginia Gentleman
grandson & heir at law to Thomas Preeson late of the County aforesaid deceas'd of the
one part & Thomas Stayton who intermarried with Elizabeth the second daughter of Hill
Drumond late of Accomack County deceas'd of the other part Witnesseth that wheress the
said Hill Drumond in his life time did pay to the said Thomas Preeson the Elder the
quantity of ten thousand pounds of tobacco in consideration that the said Thomas would
afterwards Convey to the said Hill his heirs & Assigns a certain Six hundred Acres of
Land called Wests Ridge formerly convey'd to the said Thomas the Elder by thee three
sons of Coll^o John West & the said Preeson dying before he Convey'd the said Land to
the said Hill Drumond & wheress the said Hill Drumond afterwards by his last will &
Testament did Appoint the same to be convey'd to his three eldest daughters Barbera
Elizabeth & Tabitha by the heir of the said Thomas the elder & wheress Daniel Welburn
& the said Barbera daughter of the aforesaid Hill & George Douglass & the said Tabitha
another daughter of the said Hill Drummond have by their Deeds duly executed have con-
veyed to the said Thomas Stayton who intermarried with the said Elizabeth the other
