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February the 10th Day 1732 William Dix Departed this Life About three A Clock in the Morning & made not any Written will but in the Presence & Hearing of William White & Ann Miles in his Sickness on the 4th of February Afores^d he made his Will by Word of Mouth - February the 16th Day 1732 About ten A Clock in the forenoon Came William White & Ann Miles before me one of his Majties Justices of the Peace for Accomack County & Made Oath that on the 4th of February 1732 they heard William Dix make his Will in these words viz^t - I Give to Mackwilliams Mite ffive hundred Pounds of Tobacco for to be Put ~~the~~ the Use of Schooling my Godson William Rite the Son of Mackwilliams Rite Afores^d - I Give all the Rest of my Estate to my Sister Mary Mite & She to be my Executrix, & Pay all my debts & Desired them to be Evidence.
